

The Fund's Support Priorities

This year, the Fund offers support to initiatives based on two funding streams:

1. The Power of Communities

Initiatives aimed at building community empowerment and solidarity, equipping communities to adapt to climate change, mobilize in emergencies, advocate for environmental justice, or undertake the socio-cultural transformation necessary for collective survival and well-being.

2. The Power of Narratives

Initiatives that aim to bring people together, restore hope, create narratives for the future, and facilitate the emergence of alternative solutions to existing systems from the perspective of a more connected, caring, and environmentally responsible society.

Fund Parameters

In the interest of equity, we will only accept <u>one application per organization, group or collective</u>. However, organizations, groups or collectives that have submitted an application to the Fund may also be partners in other submitted initiatives, <u>as long as these are distinct initiatives</u>.

The Fund offers two levels of funding

- Seed Funding \$15,000 per year for two years
- Implementation Funding \$30,000 per year for two years

Funding is flexible in respect of the self-determination of organizations and collectives, and of their expertise in determining their priority needs.

Funding can support the core activities of the organization or initiative, a distinct project or initiative, mobilization, convening and coalition-building costs, accessibility measures, etc.

In addition to financial support, the Fund offers an option of <u>structured support aimed at building skills and networks</u>, as well as peer-to-peer knowledge exchanges. In their application, organizations may demonstrate their interest in being part of this peer cohort and benefiting from access to dedicated resources.

January 15, 2025: Opening of the Call for Projects

January 29 at noon and February 13 at noon: Virtual Q&A sessions with the FGM team

February 21, 4 PM: Closing of the Call for Projects

February 24 to March 14: Review of Stage One applications by the FGM team with the collaboration of the Fund's Advisory Committee

March 17 to 21: Initiatives not selected for Stage Two of the Fund will be notified by FGM

March 24 to May 2: Initiatives selected for Stage Two will be invited to submit a full application via an in-depth conversation with the FGM team

May to June 2025: Review of the submitted applications and decision-making by the Fund's Advisory Committee

End of June 2025: Announcement of the grantees of the 2025 Collective Fund for Climate and Ecological Transition

June 2026 and June 2027: Follow-up conversations with the Fund grantees
